DUAL ENROLLMENT

Dual Enrollment programs allow St. Anthony High School students, at the junior and senior level, to enroll in college courses while still in a high school setting. The college credits that St. Anthony students earn through this dual-enrollment experience will be used to satisfy high school graduation requirements. In order to receive the college credits for these classes students must pass with a letter grade of "C" or above. Upon completion with a "C" or above students will receive college credit through the partnering university. St. Anthony currently offers MAT503 Contemporary Applications of Mathematics as a Dual Enrollment course offered at the St. Anthony campus through University of Wisconsin – Milwaukee. Other Dual Enrollment options are available through Milwaukee Area Technical College, but students must provide their own transportation to and from this institution.

WORK STUDY PROGRAM

The Work Study Program allows students to maintain employment while earning high school credit for real-world work skills. Students admitted to this program will be allowed to end their academic school day after the 5th hour allowing the student the last part of the school day to report to a place of employment. Students will earn 0.5 credits per semester for their participation in this program. This credit will count towards the student's elective graduation requirements.
